10:30 AM – 11:00 AM "Explosive" Look at Lobbying with New Book: The Wolves of K Street <u>Speaker</u>: Brody Mullins – Investigative Reporter – The Wall Street Journal <u>Description</u>: Brody Mullins is an investigative reporter in the Washington, DC, bureau of The Wall Street Journal, where he covers business, lobbying, and campaign finance. He was part of the team that won the 2023 Pulitzer Prize for Investigative Reporting for revealing financial conflicts of interest among officials at fifty federal agencies who bought and sold stocks of companies they were tasked with regulating. Brody Mullins has joined with fellow investigative journalist Luke Mullins, to trace the rise of the modern lobbying industry through the three dynasties—one Republican, two Democratic. Their book, The Wolves of K Street, is "a dazzling and infuriating portrait of fifty years of corporate influence in Washington, and is a masterpiece of narrative nonfiction irresistibly dramatic, spectacularly timely, explosive in its revelations, and absolutely impossible to put down."
